14th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Dear Parish Family:

“Come to me, all you who are weary and carrying heavy burdens and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me, for I am gentle and humble of heart and you will find rest for your souls, for my yoke is easy, and my burden is light.”

Many things tire us out. We all have a need for many different kinds of rest. The word rest brings to mind, images of being still, quiet, calm, peaceful, relaxed, at our leisure, not hurried, being at an oasis. Without rest, we get sick, sometimes very sick.

Today, Jesus tells us that we will gain this rest by taking his yoke upon our shoulders. The yoke was the fitted wooden collar placed on the back of an ox. The yoke was the tool that the ox needed in order to plow the field. It was custom-fitted so it wouldn't chafe or bruise the neck of the precious ox. What is Jesus' yoke that we are to take upon ourselves? His yoke included the love he carried in his heart for all. His love gave so much compassion for others. His yoke was His whole attitude to life, the way He looked on people and the relationship He had with His Father. Jesus invites us all to take His yoke upon our shoulders. To take Christ's yoke means to be like Him as one who is gentle and meek, as one who is caring and concerned for others. The question is “how have we taken Jesus' yoke upon our shoulders in our daily life? Our weaknesses and sinfulness, the way others treat us, our worries and anxieties, our seeking material things and at times, the stress of working too much to gain those material things, not giving forgiveness to others, a lack of love in our lives, these and so many other things can make the yoke of Jesus' peace difficult to experience.

When we try to live our lives not attached to Christ, we will often have a hard time dealing with many difficult aspects of life. If we struggle with hurt caused by another, we suffer from the ability to forgive that one. Holding grudges and nurturing

bitterness in our hearts can hurt us badly. It's only when we take on the attitude of Jesus, (His yoke) it's then that we allow His forgiveness of others to influence the way we treat others. He calls us to serve, to reach out to help others, to seek the help from others with our problems and difficulties. It's only when the load becomes overbearing is when we try to take over and do the pulling, or handle the load ourselves.

In our search for true and deep rest for our souls, we need look no further than the person of Jesus Christ himself. May we allow Him to carry our life burdens with and for us .

Our Vacation Bible School begins this week. We welcome all the children from our parish who will be participating this week. It will be a fun week of learning more about Jesus, activities, prayer times, singing and the joy of gathering each day with our friends. It's a going to be a beautiful weather like week, so boys and girls have a great time.

Our R.C.I.A. (Rite of Christian Initiation) classes will start up again in September. If you know someone who is interested in learning about the Catholic Church, and wishes to become a member of the Catholic Church, in mid-August there will be inquiry sessions to explain the process and to answer any questions. Watch the bulletin, or the website soon for those the listing of those inquiry sessions.

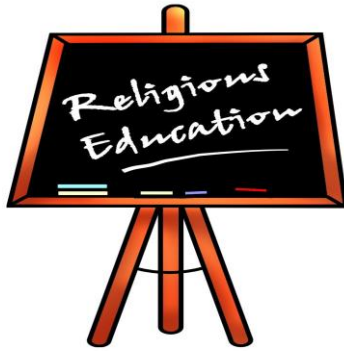

If you are new to the program, please bring a copy of your child's Baptismal Certificate.



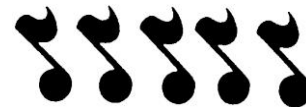
2017 VACATION BIBLE SCHOOL

ST. MARY'S PARISH 75TH ANNIVERSARY

St. Mary of the Pines, Manahawkin, will be celebrating their 75th Anniversary in July. They have invited Immaculee Ilibagiza a Rwandan Genocide Survivor to speak on faith, hope and forgiveness on Friday, July 21st at 7pm. In April of 1994, Immaculee was forced to hide in a 3 X 4 foot bathroom with several other women during the Rwandan Genocide that raged throughout her country. When she was finally liberated, she weighed only 65 pounds and found that her family had been brutally murdered as were one million of her fellow Rwandans.
