15<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time

Dear Parish Family:

If you ask any musician or actor who does live performances what they love most, the answer would be to have a receptive audience. Everyone wants a receptive audience. If we are talking to one other person, we want that person to be receptive to what we are saying. Receptivity is what today's gospel is about. Basically, the sower desires that the seeds he has planted in the soil to be receptive in producing a good crop. It is easy for us to see in today's parable that much of the soil was not receptive, and so the seed just died. Jesus is using this illustration to show that the hearts of many people who hear God's word are not open to really taking it.

How open are we to God's word? How do we create a receptive heart that can help us to understand God's word and truly living it daily? In the parable, it is necessary to get rid of the obstacles that block the growth of the seed. Jesus is referring to people whose hearts are closed, they shut their eyes and ears from seeing and hearing how to live the word. What are the obstacles that have to be removed? Maybe one of the obstacles we can try to remove is how we relate to other people. In our conversations and dealing with others, are we always talking and not listening? Do we judge others while they are talking to us? Do people enjoy talking to us, or do we turn them off because we may have a tendency to be opinionated? Do we interrupt others before they even have a chance to finish speaking? So often we may need to do a reality check with ourselves to see what needs to be changed so that we can be more receptive to others.

In the spiritual sense, being open to God's word means that we have to listen to the word, through the scriptures, through the homily given about the word and maybe even do a little extra reading regarding the word. It's when we listen, then we have the ability to respond in the way God would want us to. Prayer is a good example of

dialogue. It requires that we listen with an open heart to what the Lord wishes to tell us.

So maybe this week, let us get rid of the "old soil" of our lives, the preoccupations, obsessions and cravings, and to let God's word become the rich soil in helping us to be more receptive to His word and living that word with sincere heart.

What a tremendous week our children had at our Annual Vacation Bible School. Over 100 young boys and girls filled Rucki Hall each day learning of God, building ways to continue growing with God in their lives. It was a picture perfect week, thanks to Miss Kristen Weinbel, our director and her many wonderful and outstanding volunteers. All of you made this week so special for our little ones. Enjoy the rest of these summer days.

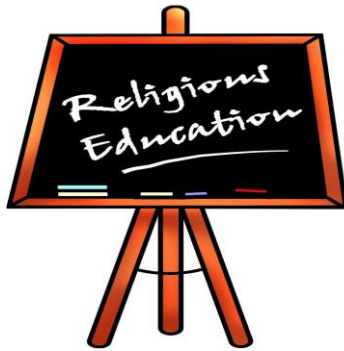
