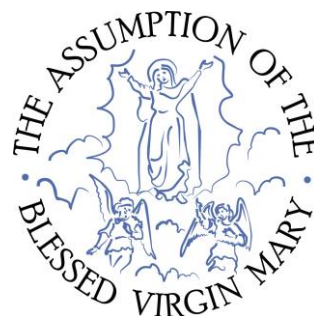

19th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Dear Parish Family,

Most stories in the Bible have meanings for three different time frames: the time it was written, the time it written about, and our time.

The story in today's Gospel is a perfect example of this. When Matthew wrote his account of Jesus' life, the church was shaky. There were persecutions, tensions between Jewish and Gentile Christians about following Jewish law and ritual, Jesus ascending into heaven. The Church felt the boat was sinking, the Church needed to know that Jesus was still here to help them.

Our times are stormy too. Morality is out of bounds. We live in an "isms" world, materialism, secular humanism, and fundamentalism. We are battling a lot of strong winds each day. We need to know that Jesus is still here to help us. Sometimes, we can be like Peter, asking for a sign as proof. Well, the Lord is here, he's all around us and he comes in the unexpected places and ways. So how can we recognize Him?

Well, first, the Lord speaks to us through prayer. He is present to us in the sacraments we receive; they are signs of his love, His power to heal, to save, and to give life. Jesus is present in His Word. He comes alive for us in the scriptures. We hear how He intervenes into the lives of others before us and how He still can be with us today. Jesus meets us in every liturgy. He is physically present to us in Holy Communion assuring us that He is always with us.

Jesus is asking of us to give Him our confidence and assurance that we do believe, we do trust, we want to continue journeying with Him, despite the obstacles, the storm winds of life. What kind of a response will we give Him? It may not be as grand as walking on water, but it may be a tiny whispering sound, like Elijah experienced, or it may be just a simple as a smile that can make all the difference in the world.

R.C.I.A. programs will be this Wednesday, August 16th at 7:00 p.m. at Rucki Hall. An explanation of the program and any questions that one may have will be answered at that time. Our next session will be on Wednesday August, 23rd at 7:00 p.m. Rucki Hall. The R.C.I.A. program will be beginning shortly, so it's important that those interested attend these inquiry sessions.

Registration for Religious Education for grades 1 thru 6th is still taking place. Please note that **NO REGISTRATION** will take place the first week that the program begins. So, if you haven't registered your young ones for classes now is the time to do so. Please remind your friends and neighbors.

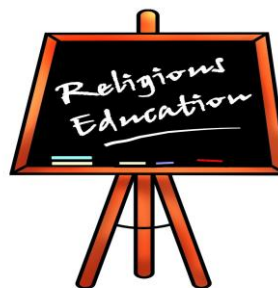
BAPTISM PREPARATION CLASS
