Dear Parish Family:

Some years ago as part of a survey, a question was asked of parents at what age of a child was the easiest for a parent. When they were 5 weeks old or 5 years old? When they were 12 years old or 22 years old? Is there ever a time that was considered easy? Obviously, there is no easy time to be a conscientious parent. Most parents admit they had to grow into their responsibilities, they did not foresee everything from the start.

Well, in following Jesus it is like being a parent because it calls for a greater self-sacrifice under changing conditions. We never know the full price of following Jesus at the outset.

Jeremiah says, "You tricked me. I didn't think it was going to be like this." Jeremiah would like to have a life of less hassle and more respect. Peter wanted a cut-rate price for following Jesus. Peter doesn't like the idea of Jesus suffering. He's not too happy following someone headed for crucifixion. He learns the cost of discipleship. Jesus tells Peter that one day he will stretch out his hands and another will take him where he would not like to go.

We too love and want to follow Jesus, but often we want to find discipleship as if it were on sale. We are afraid of taking Jesus "too seriously" than of not taking him seriously enough.

Discipleship and parenting stretch one beyond selfishness. There is no age of a child when being a parent is easy, nor is there any easy time to be a good disciple. Self-sacrifice is part of following Jesus at every turn in the road.

May the Eucharist we celebrate and receive each week, be for us the food for this journey of following Jesus as a true disciple until we enter into our eternal home where we will feast in great splendor the heavenly banquet of life.
