Dear Parish Family:

Duty is a four-letter word that no one is ashamed to use. All kinds of people seem to like the word “duty”: mothers and fathers, husbands and wives, teachers, boy scouts, policemen, firemen, even politicians. Even the Church uses the word “duty” in its Rite of Baptism for children. In addressing the parents, the priest says; “it will be your duty to bring them up to keep God’s commandments as Christ taught us, by loving God and our neighbor.” The priest also asks the godparents: “Are you ready to help these parents in their duty as Christian mothers and fathers?”

But “duty” is not so much a word to be talked about as something to be done. The idea of reward has often been associated with the idea of duty. Often when we are drawn to doing our duty, it is really the reward that we are drawn to; a reward that we can see and touch and hold on to.

Jesus knew that his disciples might have such an attitude when it came to serving God. That’s why he told them that seeking a reward cannot be the motive for serving God and others. Rather God gives us more gifts of mercy and forgiveness than we could ever deserve. God only asks us to use these gifts in ways that will bring a sense of joy into our lives. What God has done for us is part of the mystery of divine love. That divine love is centered in Jesus, the center of our lives.

In celebration of the 100th Anniversary of Our Lady of Fatima, we will have a Public Square Rosary Crusade to be held on Saturday, October 14th at 12 Noon in the Church. An invitation is extended to all our parishioners to come and be a part of the 20,000 rallies what will take place all across the United States on that day and time.
