31st Sunday in Ordinary Time

Dear Parish Family:

Something happens to many of us as we begin to grow older. We long to be admired and praised by others. We like to tell others about our accomplishments, our education, where we have traveled or where we hope to go. Sometimes we may exaggerate our tale a bit so that it sounds more exotic than it is. We are always looking for affirmation and praise from others, and we will do anything in order to get it. The strange thing is that we have been given the greatest affirmation we could ever get, the affirmation of a God who knows no bounds in the caring that he lavishes on us.

In today's Gospel, Jesus criticizes the religious leader by saying, "They do all their deeds to be seen by others." Their main motivation was not love, but self-promotion. Good deeds were only used to get the positive attention of others. That can be very dangerous. It makes us dependent upon the reactions of others. Why do we have to tell people, especially the new ones we meet all about ourselves and our accomplishments? Maybe it's because we think that is the best way they will get to know us. In reality, that's not true.

Our friends get to really know us when we allow them to see us apart from jobs and our extra activities of life. When they see us doing something, maybe carrying out a task of caring for another, others can see something unique in that person. Bragging about what we do, where we have been, and the achievement made does not help to build long lasting relationship.

What we need to do is practice the virtue of humility. Humility involves the full knowledge of our status as created by God and developing a clear consciousness of having received everything we have from God. Of course, this requires a complete dependence upon God. We don't focus on our nothingness; rather focus on the God who is everything, all loving, all good and all caring. When we see God as a loving Father, acknowledging all that we have comes from His

divine providence, than we become what are meant to be, a true follower of His.
