5th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Dear Parish Family:

Have you ever been to a circus? Almost every circus has a high wire act. It's amazing how the performer walks a tight rope high in the air. The skill most needed for this dangerous undertaking is "balance." Without balance, a person would not be able to take more than a few steps without falling to the ground. Interesting as it seems, many tightrope walkers use a large pole for their balance that they hold around the chest level. The pole actually gives them more of a chance at balance than anything else.

In some ways, you and I are in a kind of circus that requires continual balance. Life is often heavy on one side! Usually that side is made up of too much activity. Many of us are always trying to catch up with ourselves. We are always going too fast, and don't know how to get out of the rat race.

Well even 2000 years ago, Jesus was aware of the need of balance! He knew that he needed to preach and show signs that God's kingdom has come, curing the sick, casting out the demons, forgiving sins, but he also knew that he needed prayer and quiet to stay firmly on level with his father's plan. Our Gospel tells us that in the morning while it was very dark, Jesus got up went to a deserted place and prayed. Very interesting, that even Jesus himself needed that special time for himself. What about us??

The stress level for many people today is totally out of whack! We definitely have lost our balance. When lives are made up of 99% activity and only 1% prayer, there is something definitely not right. Maybe we need to make some time even if it's 3,5,10, minutes a day, whether it's when we go to bed or when we get up in the morning, we need that time for prayer. We need time to reflect on God's presence in our lives. Time to look at ourselves and ask the question, why are we running at such great speeds? We need time to figure out what is really necessary in life?

The balancing act is a tough one! But with a lot of practice, you can do it. Try now, try today, tomorrow or begin with the season of Lent that begins next week. You'll be glad you did! It's a sure guarantee!

Our annual Lenten Retreat begins next Sunday. Fr. Carlos will be speaking at all the Masses inviting you to attend the retreat on Monday, and Tuesday, February 12th & 13th at 7:00 p.m. in the Church. What a great way to begin the Season of Lent the next day. Fr. invites all of our parishioners to come and join him.

St. Barnabas Altar Rosary Society will be selling tickets for their annual Fish/Chicken Dinner next weekend Feb. 17th & 18th, and again the following weekend the 24th & 25th. The dinner will be held on Saturday, March 3rd at 5:00 p.m. in Fr. Brennan Hall.

At the last cohort meeting, plans are underway to begin the process of collaboration among the parishes and to allow each ministry to follow "Best Practices," in coordinating joint functions and activities within the cohort. Msgr. Tuzeneu of St. Mary's will be leading the music ministry, Fr. Lambeth of St. Theresa will lead the children's religious education, Fr. Scullion of St. Francis will lead the parish staff, Fr. Baszianin of St. Pius and myself will be leading the Youth Ministry. Working together can be a positive impact in our collaboration process. Our Latino people will be assisting the Latino's from Barnegat, Long Beach Island and Tuckerton in helping to create a Spanish Center at St. Mary's Barnegat.

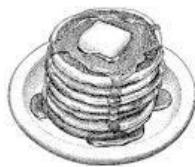
