6th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Dear Parish Family:

“Jesus stretched out his hand and touched him.” A simple statement, yet there is something so special and wonderful about the touch of someone who loves you and can sympathize with you. The man who Jesus cured had leprosy. He had to live far away from his family and friends. He had to live alone. So, he found himself not only suffering physically from his disease, but also subjected to loneliness, perhaps suffering was at times even worse than his physical illness.

Loneliness can drive people into many different directions. People experience loneliness often times by burying themselves in false solutions. They may bury themselves in their work or get involved in many different activities so that they won't be reminded of how deeply separated they feel.

One type of loneliness or the feeling of separation is when we ignore our consciences and live some part of our lives in a way that we know is not pleasing to God. Sin always has the effect of separating us from God, others and even ourselves. Jesus wishes to reach out and to touch us, like He did to the man in today's gospel. He is still as caring today as he was when He walked on this earth.

It's through the Sacrament of Reconciliation (Confession) that Jesus continues to touch us in our loneliness. The Sacrament of Reconciliation is a gift generously given to us. In this Sacrament, we are able to be released from those trappings we get ourselves into. So, in this Sacrament, Jesus allows us to experience a warm and healing welcome back into the family of God, the Church. It's a pure gift, it's a valuable gift, and it's a gift that Jesus continually offers to us.

In a few days, Lent will begin with Ash Wednesday. What a perfect opportunity to once again receive this precious gift of the Lord's healing touch through the Sacrament. Just like the leper who came to Jesus with a burning desire to be made

whole again and Jesus didn't let him down. May we enter into this Lenten Season with the same desire; “If you choose, you can make me clean.” Be assured He will not disappoint you.

We are most grateful to Fr. Carlos for leading us these days in our Lenten Mission. Let us take this opportunity to put our best foot out in making this season of Lent truly a meaningful time for us to grow closer to the Lord.

This Wednesday is Ash Wednesday, the beginning of Lent. It's a day of fast and abstinence. Today's bulletin has the regulations concerning fasting and abstinence and also the times of Masses and services with the distribution of ashes. Please keep the schedule handy for a quick reference.

A tradition during the Lent is the Stations of the Cross. Beginning Friday, February 16th and every Friday, Stations of the Cross will be held at 7:00 p.m. in the Church. Booklets are available for the service.

Next weekend is Pledge Sunday for the Annual Catholic Appeal throughout the Diocese of Trenton. Each year our Bishop seeks the support of all the members of the diocese to further the work of our ministries. Each of us has a vital part in all we do in Christ's name, and each of us can share in all we do with a gift to the Annual Catholic Appeal. Our single Act of Faith propels the works of love that build up our Church. You can make it happen with a generous gift to the ACA.

This year St. Barnabas' share of the goal is \$90,000.00. As the people of the diocese, you have an opportunity to help others see Christ working in our midst. I ask you to take a moment and truly reflect on how you can help. We truly need everyone to participate. I am always grateful and moved by the support you give to our parish. I thank you for this support, and may God bless you and your family.

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

During the days and weeks of penance that lie ahead – **Ash Wednesday, February 14th until Holy Thursday, March 29th** – the Catholic Church throughout the world commemorates the penitential season of Lent. The model Jesus gave us for “these forty days” was his own experience in the desert and the temptations that followed him there where he encountered Satan face to face. And yet, Jesus, there in the desert – alone, fasting and in intense prayer – beat back the devil and triumphed over temptation, as strong and as unrelenting as it was throughout those forty days.

We enter the desert of Lent like Jesus, led by the Holy Spirit, to face our devils our temptations head on. But we are not alone. The Lord Jesus Christ is with us. And so, too, is the Church, the entire community of faith observing Lent. Here is what the Catholic Church in the United States requires of us as baptized Catholics:

1. **The days of FAST (only one full meal) and ABSTINENCE (no meat) are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. No dispensations are granted on these solemn days except for reason of sickness or those provided in canon law below.**

Valentine’s Day falls on Ash Wednesday, February 14th this year. Since Ash Wednesday is one of only two solemn penitential days, no dispensations will be granted.

St. Patrick’s Day, March 17th, falls on a Saturday this year.

2. **All other Fridays of Lent are days of ABSTINENCE (no meat).**

Those between the ages of 18 and 59 are obliged to FAST (only one full meal) as above. From the age of 14, people are also obliged to ABSTAIN (no meat: this obligation prohibits the eating of meat, but not eggs, milk products or condiments of any kind, even though made from animal fat).

The obligation to observe the laws of fast and abstinence is a serious one for Catholics. Failure to observe one penitential day in itself is not considered a serious sin. It is the failure to observe any penitential days at all, or a substantial number of penitential days, that must be considered serious. The obligation, the

privilege really, of receiving the Eucharist at least once a year – often called “Easter duty” – for those in the state of grace should still be fulfilled during the period from the **First Sunday of Lent, February 17-18 to Trinity Sunday, May 26-27th**. However, the Church’s law does permit this precept to be fulfilled at another time during the year when there is just cause.

I want to encourage Catholics to go to confession and make use of the sacrifices and traditions that have always been a part of our Lenten practices in the Church.

We do, indeed, fast and pray with the Lord Jesus and with our fellow Catholics. May this Lent be a time of penance leading to grace and joy for us all at Easter.

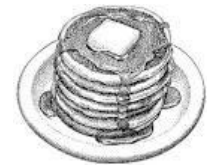
