Dear Parish Family:

What happens when a person goes into a rage? Rage doesn't come from nowhere, does it? Usually, something has been fermenting inside the person. He or she was been consumed with thoughts and feelings about some event or issue. The terrible inner unrest keeps growing until something sparks off an explosion.

What was so disturbing to Jesus that it eventually came out in such a rage? Jesus was enraged when he found people trying to play games with God. As long as they made the right sacrifices, with the right animals, and using the right money, then they were satisfied that everything was going to be okay. They thought that by doing the right thing at least on the outside, then God would be satisfied with them. This kind of attitude was making God into something very small. Jesus saw this attitude really dishonoring God by their pretensions at doing well. These thoughts drove Jesus into a frenzy and he made a mess of their little business of selling the right things to people.

As we approach this third week of Lent, we are reminded of the true meaning of repentance and conversion. We don't make ourselves pleasing in God's sight by doing things that only look good on the outside, but rather paying attention to what is going on in the inside of us. We judge ourselves and others by how well we keep the external laws, but God will judge us on what's going on inside of us on its truth and sincerity of our actions. He wants us not only to keep the commandments, but to go beyond them, to live them sincerely and genuinely every day, even outside of Lent.

As we continue our Lenten journey, let us ask the Lord to help us fashion our hearts after His own heart. May we give ourselves, not only for others to see, but to give as generously as we can, that which only the Lord himself can see. A loving heart can be found in any human being----a hateful

heart can be found in any human being----what kind of a heart are we making these days for the Lord?

“Jesus, meek and humble of heart, make our hearts like unto thine.....”
