18th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Dear Parish Family:

Were you ever hungry for something but you didn't know what for? You go to the refrigerator, open the door look all over it, but were still hungry? Were you ever thirsty? Again, you look in the refrigerator to find something to satisfy your thirst but couldn't find the beverage? Do you have everything in life that's important, a family, a job, an income, but still feel something is missing? If your answers are yes, then today's scriptures could have an important message for you.

The message is that there are two kinds of hunger in the world. There's the physical which only food could satisfy and the spiritual which no food could satisfy. In other words, we can be rich and successful and still feel hunger inside us. For example: There's a story about a man named Sam, a 45 year old male, president of a large company, drove a Mercedes, owned a beautiful house along the river, has a lovely family. But he was not happy! Something was missing in his life. One day, Sam had a religious experience that changed His life. He began to pray better, attended Mass every Sunday, and did some reading of the scriptures and the life of the saints.

Let's go back to the question at hand. Have you ever hungered for something deep inside and didn't know what? Well, the answer is found in today's reading. **"I am the bread of life. He who comes to me will never be hungry again. He who believes in me shall not thirst."** Yes, there is a deep down hunger and thirst in all of us that only Jesus can fill.

St. Augustine, a bishop and doctor of the Church once said, **"Our hearts are restless O Lord, and they cannot rest until they rest in thee."** That message of St. Augustine and the reflection of today's gospel is the message that has brought new meaning to millions of lives. It can bring new meaning to our lives too, if we but let it!

The United States Conference of Catholic Bishop's Pro-Life has invited all Catholics to join together in common prayer and action to promote the Church's Pro-Life efforts. The USCCB has asked that each Friday be a time of "prayer and, when possible, fasting for life." The USCCB is recommending praying **One Our Father, One Hail Mary, One Glory Be** for the intention of life from conception to natural death. In conjunction, our Bishop has given us another prayer that can also be said every Friday: ***"O God, our Creator, all life is in your hands from conception until death. Help us to cherish our children and to reverence the awesome privilege of our share in creation. May all people live and die in dignity and love. Bless all those who defend the rights of the unborn, the handicapped and the aged. Enlighten and be merciful toward those who fail to love, and give them peace. Let freedom be tempered by responsibility, integrity and morality. We ask this through Christ the Lord. Amen."***
