19th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Dear Parish Family:

All of us have had those moments in life, when we like to question all kinds of things, e.g. “We question God’s existence.” “We question whether there is a life after death.” “We question whether Jesus is all we say He is.” Such a moment often overtakes us, when all feels lost and the world seems to come crashing down on us. For example: “when one has lost a child, or has been laid off from a job and worries the house would be foreclosed, or one who has suffered abuse, or has nursed a loved one through a terminal illness has known a moment when they wondered if there is a God, and where is He?”

So the question is “how do we keep faith in these difficult times?” Jesus said, “no one can come to me unless the father draws him. “ When the body, mind and spirit are worn almost lifeless by pain and stress, when our heart lies heavy as a stone and our only prayer is a cry of frustration of God’s absence, God draws us into the love which nothing can separate.

Quietly, gently and unnoticed, like a drop of water coming down a rock, God infuses us with a faith that restores our life. Jesus is that faith. He is the living bread come down from heaven. Whoever eats this bread will live forever. God’s love and desire for us, causes us to ask him to be sustenance even when our weary hearts express our doubt.

Let us always keep this thought in mind as we pray: “Give us this day our daily bread” for we love Him for his presence in us which lets us trust him, even in the darkness and let us know that all will be made well. Remember, Jesus’ words: “I am with you always.” Never forget that basic truth of our faith.

Wednesday, August 15th is the Feast of the Assumption of Our Blessed Mother. It’s a holyday of obligation. Masses are on Tuesday, August 14th at 7:00 p.m. and on Wednesday, August 15th at 8:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. Please make note of these times.

I ask all of you to take a few minutes each day and say this prayer together with all our brothers and sisters through the United States.

Next Sunday, Fr. Jude Ezeigbo from the Diocese of Nigeria will be speaking at all the Masses seeking our prayers and financial support towards our Annual Mission Cooperative Collection. All the churches throughout the United States are assigned a missionary to come and seek the help needed to continue the work of Evangelization, training of seminarians, and providing the necessary human needs that many of the people lack in those third world countries. Your generosity towards the second collection which will go directly to Fr. Jude’s appeal will be greatly appreciated.

Our Rectory Office will be closed on Wednesday, August 15th in observance of the Holyday. It will reopen again on Thursday at 9:00 a.m.

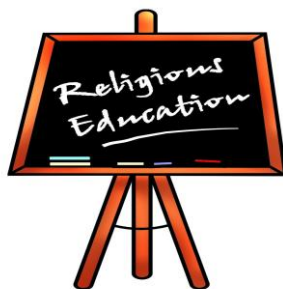
