31st Sunday in Ordinary Time

Dear Parish Family:

Probably all of us have seen and used a can of Lysol spray. Lysol, sprayed around the bathroom kills odors, germs and even cold and flu viruses, and kills them on contact. So, if we buy a can of Lysol and use it, we will have a sense of security. Our homes can be antiseptic and those germs will be dead. We live in an antiseptic world. An antiseptic area is an isolated area. We also live most our lives with blinders on. Blinders are put on a horse so that the horse can only see in front of himself. Our lives are so antiseptic that we can only see in front of ourselves. We are isolated from the truth of the wider world.

The lawyer in today's Gospel was suffering from his own antiseptic world. He knew there were 613 commandments in the law; he wanted to know which one was the most important. He was so tied up with commandments he forgot the purpose of them. So Jesus broadened this lawyer's world and said that there are two commandments and they are both equal. Loving God is somewhat easy. We can all say that we love God. Making our love of neighbor, however, to that love of God requires compassion. Compassion means that we suffer with or that we empathize with another person. In our antiseptic world, we seldom do this, because we do not see the suffering of other people. We never take off our blinders. A good example is that of gossiping, the spreading of stories or rumors whether true or not, is damaging to another's reputation.

When we remove our blinders and look around, we begin to see the injustices in our world. We can speak out against injustices. We can vote for persons who promise to eliminate injustices. Remember, where there is a will there is always a way. We must first begin with ourselves. If we truly love God, our neighbor and ourselves, then we cannot live in our antiseptic world. One spray of Lysol will not make those pesky injustices go away.
