32nd Sunday on Ordinary Time

Dear Parish Family:

We all heard the expression “God loves a cheerful giver!” There are three kinds of givers; there are the “grudge givers,” the “duty givers,” and the thankful givers.” The “grudge giver” usually says, “I hate to give.” The “duty giver” most likely says, “I ought to give.” But it’s the “thankful giver” that says “I want to give.” In other words, the grudge givers give reluctantly and with a certain amount of resentment. The duty giver gives reluctantly too but with a sense of true obligation. The thankful giver on the other hand, gives freely and always from the heart.

The story of the widow in today’s Gospel is a good example of a thankful giver. She gave not under constraint or obligation, but rather from her heart. Today’s readings invite us to ask ourselves “How do we give?” Do we give grudgingly, dutifully, or because we want to? Of course, we’re not just talking about the concept of money, but rather let’s talk about the giving of ourselves and our time. Let’s take a good look at ourselves and ask the questions, like, how do I give myself and time to God, in daily prayer and at Sunday Mass. Do I go because it’s an obligation or do I go because I truly need the help of God to assist me with the many things I have to contend with in my life? How do I give myself and time to my family in support and affection? The time spent with my family helps to build a stronger bond of togetherness and love. How do I give myself and time to my neighbor, or sharing my talents with those that are less fortunate, volunteering some time in organizations that assists the needy?

It’s financial Sunday at St. Barnabas. Our Gospel today of the widow giving all she could can be a great reminder for us on how well are we giving our very best to our parish. Which one of the givers are we? Do we give grudgingly, because we have to or because if we don’t we will be criticized or penalized in some way? Or, do we give dutifully

out of obligation, meaning that I’d rather not give but feel obligated to do so? Or, do we give thankfully, because we want to. That is do we give with a generous and full heart as did the widow.

If our giving is less than it should be, then Jesus is speaking to us in a special way, directly and personally. Jesus reminded us, elsewhere in the Gospel “the measure to which you measure will be measured back to you.” Indeed, you will receive a full measure, a generous helping portion into your hands and more than you can hold.

Finally, a little meditation on how God gives so generously to us!

We ask for a flower---He gives us a bouquet. We ask for a drop of water---He gives us an ocean. We ask for a grain of sand---He gives us a beach. We ask for blade of grass---He gives us a lawn. We ask for something to eat----He gives us His own Body and Blood.

Thank you Lord for being so generous to us, help us always to be as generous to you with all that you have blessed us with each day. Amen.

Monday, November 12th is Veterans Day. Our rectory office and adoration will be closed in observance of the holiday. Let us remember in prayers not only this day, but every day, the countless men and women who served in the various branches of our military to continue preserving the great gift of freedom we so enjoy each day. Let us pray for those who have died in the various conflicts of war, may God reward them with the great gift of eternal life. To all our veterans, we say thank you for your service.

On Sunday, November 18th after the 10:30 a.m. Mass, we will have our annual Thanksgiving Food Sort in Father Brennan Hall. If anyone would like to help with this project please come into the hall immediately after Mass. Last year, we had many hands and it made it so easy to accomplish. Let’s do it again on Sunday, November 18th. Many thanks!!!!

Once again, I’m reaching to you for your assistance in this year’s Catholic Annual Appeal. Thus far, we have raised \$65,677.00 towards our goal of \$90,000.00. We are approaching Thanksgiving; why not make a pledge to the Catholic Annual Appeal in thanksgiving for the many blessings we have received. Big or small, it makes no difference; all pledges go to help the various ministries within our diocese and also a

return to our parish. Pledge cards are available at the exits of the Church or at the rectory during business hours.
