17th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Dear Parish Family:

There's a story told about an angel appearing at a faculty meeting one day and tells the headmaster that in compensation for loyalty and great interest in the school, the Lord will grant him with the choice of wealth, wisdom or beauty. Without even thinking, the headmaster selects wisdom. It is granted immediately, and the angel disappears. At the faculty meeting, all heads turn towards the headmaster who is sitting with a faint halo of light around him. They are all waiting to hear him speak, when suddenly; one of the faculty members spoke up! "Say something?" The headmaster looks at them and said; "I should have taken the money."

How many of us think of ourselves as being wise? In the Gospel, Jesus seems to be saying that the wise person is one who has seen what is most valuable in life, and will do anything necessary to be true to that most valuable of things. He uses the image of the pearl or the hidden treasure to tell us most forcefully that the only way to really live is to be centered, focused, not scattered.

Life is about love, people, kindness, forgiveness, understanding, compassion and justice. It's not about how many rooms we have in our house, or how many cars are in our driveways. It's about attachment and detachment. We must be attached to learning, to find the wisdom that God wishes us to have. Sometimes it's in praying. Sometimes it is in reading. Sometimes it's letting God more into our lives, or it means being quiet, listening more rather than talking a lot.

Our life is made up of many choices, but it's our choice that will allow us to be detached from those things hindering us from the wisdom we need in our lives. As we go through our days this week, let us be open to the many choices that we will face and searching its meaning and obtaining the wisdom to make those choices will gain for us new insights into our relationship with God and with one another.

Once again, your generosity towards our Maintenance Collection has made it possible to put 12 new windows in the rectory offices, replacing the original ones from 50 years ago. Soon, I will let you know of our next project. Your generosity towards next week's maintenance collection will be greatly appreciated. Thank you.

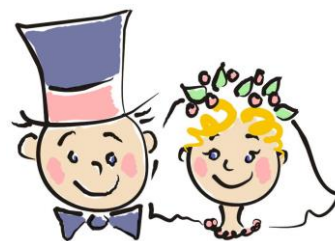
TIME TO PREPARE FOR SCHOOL
