20<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time

Dear Parish Family;

There is a story told about two men in an airplane and suddenly the plane developed engine trouble. It was clear that they were going to be killed. One said to the other, "Well, this is it. We're going to die. Are you religious??"

The one said, "No, are you?" The first said, "Well, I'm not either, but I think we'd better do something religious, because we're going to be dead in about 60 seconds. Can't you remember anything religious we could do?" The other man said, "Well, I used to live next door to a Catholic Church, and I used to hear those people in there. Maybe I could quote some of it." We've only got twenty seconds left," said the other man. "So you better hurry." The man looked up at the ceiling and then began to speak, "under the B-3; under the I-29; under the N, 32..."

Today's Gospel is both embarrassing and confusing. It paints Jesus in harsh colors. A pagan woman comes to him for help. At first he ignores her. Next he tells her his mission is only for the Jews. Then he insults her by saying it's not right to take away the food of sons and daughters and throw it to the dogs.

Is this really Jesus speaking? In fact, it is not. Jesus did heal the pagan woman's daughter. This account of the event was not written down by Matthew until 40 years later. It was at that time, the church was embroiled in a bitter internal struggle between its Jewish and Gentile converts. So when Matthew, a Jewish convert, wrote down his Gospel, he was still partly stuck in his prejudice against Jews, and he put his prejudices on Jesus lips.

That's what prejudice always does. It doesn't reach into the heart but sees only what's on the surface. That's what we do sometimes; stop at the outside, at the surface, seeing very little of the reality. Jesus always went to the inside, and looked to the heart and listened to what was there.

Matthew's blind spot, allowed him to insert his prejudices in today's gospel, which made it embarrassing, but it's a gift in disguise. It's a warning to the best of us that we can live blindly like the two pilots who thought that Bingo numbers solemnly spoken could get them to heaven. So, look to the inside and learn to listen to your hearts. What you'll find there are people beyond numbers. Learn to listen to hearts and you'll never walk alone again.

On Saturday, September 16<sup>th</sup>, we will have our Annual Commissioning Ceremony of blessing all of our parish organizations at the 4:00 p.m. Mass. Following the Mass we will have our parish picnic. There will be entertainment for the children, music, food, etc. etc. So mark your calendars and more information will be forth coming in the bulletin.
