25th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Dear Parish Family:

A story is told how a police officer pulled over an older woman for speeding one day. He asked for her license and examined it carefully. "Well lady," he said, "you're not much of a driver, but I'm glad to see you aren't one of those women who have their photo's retouched to get rid of all those wrinkles." "Officer," said the woman indignantly, "you are looking at my thumb print!"

In today's Gospel, they all received the usual daily wage! Whether their workday began 5:00 p.m. or at the crack of dawn, they all got paid the same amount. It hardly seems like a good business practice to treat employees in this manner, but the landowner is clear; "My friend, I am not cheating you. Did you not agree with me for the usual daily wage?"

The kingdom of God as this parable illustrates really gives us the potential to live in the realm of Christ as a win-win situation. The win-win situation is not a popular notion for those of us who are more accustomed to living in a highly competitive world. So often our value and self-worth is based on our earnings and not on the ways that we experience unmerited, unearned generosity. We live in a world which so often promotes a sense that "might makes right." Jesus gives us a different value system. In the Kingdom only "right makes right." We often fail to see this when we are more concerned about getting ahead of our neighbor.

Everything we have, life, talents, love, second chances, fresh starts, they're all gifts. And do you know what God is saying to us with all these unearned gifts? He's saying, "I love you, and I want to share my life with you." But how many of us are getting the message? It's quite easy to tell. Just look at your face and eyes each day. Are they peaceful and happy? If so, you got the message. Only we can choose! Just say "Yes" to the invitation of our God.

On the weekend of September 30th and October 1st, our Altar Rosary Society will be

celebrating its 50th Anniversary. An invitation is extended to all our parishioners to come into Brennan Hall for our Hospitality Weekend to enjoy some delicious delights and to congratulate the members of the Altar Rosary Society.

On Sunday, October 1st, in anticipation of the feast of St. Francis of Assisi, we will have our annual Blessing of Animals at 2:00 p.m. in front of the Church. We invite all our parishioners to bring their favorite pets for this blessing through the intercession of St. Francis.
