Dear Parish Family,

How many times have we heard, “You know so and so, He’s so full of himself.” That’s an interesting expression. When you think about it, aren’t we all full of ourselves? What this expression means, is that a person who is full of himself, or herself does not have any room for anyone else. They are so taken up with their own importance and their own interests, that they don’t have time for someone else!

Jesus knew that this was a major problem for the chief priests and elders, and that’s why he told the story of the two sons! Basically, what Jesus wanted to teach them was the importance of changing one’s mind. The son who first said “No” but then changed his mind, he wasn’t so full of himself, and he was stuck in only one way of acting. It’s only the proud person who doesn’t change one’s mind. He or she thinks that there’s no need for change at least on their part. So often pride gets in the way! Pride is clinging behavior. Clinging to our control, our self-image, our comfort it prevents a person from growing in the life of Christ. Pride can infect our lives. It can blind us to what we are doing to ourselves or others. It also prevents us from getting help or to see things in a new way. Pride can end up actually killing people.

So what’s the remedy? “Humility” Like our second reading today states: “do nothing from selfish ambitions or conceit, but in humility, regard others as better than yourself...” Humility is learning to receive! It’s the hidden secret of a happy life. May we pray always for the grace to be humble so as to be filled the presence and love of God.
