28th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Dear Parish Family:

Listening to our reading today, we might well call today “Banquet Sunday”. Our readings are filled with images of juicy, rich foods, and choice wines, tables spread and cups overflowing, of bullocks and corn-fed cattle. Festive meals were very important in Jewish culture as in ours.

From the very beginning, people have celebrated significant events with special meals; e.g. Holidays (Christmas, Thanksgiving, Easter, birthdays, anniversaries, weddings, etc.) What makes a meal significant is not only the sharing of food but the sharing of ourselves. During the meal, life stories are exchanged, children and family happenings are shared. Dreams and future plans are revealed. We take time from our busy schedules to share and feed our deeper hungers. But not only are pleasant things shared, but also hardships of life, the pain of illness, the sorrow of loss, the confusions and perplexities of child raising, the “little disasters of life”.

It’s no wonder that God describes His kingdom as a universal banquet and Jesus would choose a meal as a remembrance of his life and death. At the Last Supper, Jesus summed up for his intimate friends, his life of total giving by sharing bread and wine. It was meal to celebrate his victory over death. It was meal to celebrate our victory over ourselves. It was a meal to celebrate over and over until he would come again. Jesus asked us to do what he did, to take the bread, the substance of our lives, and the cup symbolizing the joy of our life in him and share it with others.

The family meal is meant to be a source of family unity and love. So often it is not that. It can be hectic and is frequently decided by conveniences--- sports have invaded our tables, family wars are fought at the table. The family meal is the prime occasion for building understanding and closeness. Family meals can be the greatest gifts parents can give their children.

Memories that will last the longest and have the deepest impression will be the family meals.

Today, God invites all of us to share in another meal. He offers us rich food and drink, his very person that we might truly live. The Eucharist is the greatest gift God can give to us his children. Let us treasure this gift of God’s love as we continue to treasure the gift of sharing in our family meals each day.
