2nd Sunday in Ordinary Time

Dear Parish Family:

All of us are probably familiar with the expression "Open Door Policy." An open-door policy is one where a person is accessible to anyone. The phrase does not mean that we leave open the doors of our homes, offices or businesses. So, often, we chain, lock and bolt the doors in order to protect the contents within.

Sometimes, the locked doors of our homes reflect the locked doors of our hearts. The disciples were behind locked doors because they were afraid of the Jews. Their hearts were locked in to believing in the resurrection of Jesus. Jesus wanted to pass through the locked doors of their hearts. He wants them to believe in Him.

What doors of our hearts do we have locked that need to be entered by Jesus? Maybe for some of us it's our indifference to other people. We usually label them in groups. Another door to healing reconciliation is that of grudges. Sometimes we carry them around for years; we fail to forgive because of what was said to us or what was done to us. Another door may be that of understanding. How often do we fail to distinguish between understanding one and agreeing with one? Understanding means listening to the other person and trying to understand them. We don't have to always agree with them, nor them with us. But always leave in peace.

Like the apostles, we gather asking Jesus to unlock the doors of prejudice, of healing and reconciliation, and understanding. For some of us it is more difficult for Jesus to get through than for others. Just like the Father who unlocked the door of life for Jesus, Jesus continues to unlock the doors of our hearts. He needs no key, just an invitation. Jesus stands knocking on our doors. He knocks with His word and with the bread and wine, His body and blood. He's knocking, do you hear him? If you do let Him in and rejoice in His love.

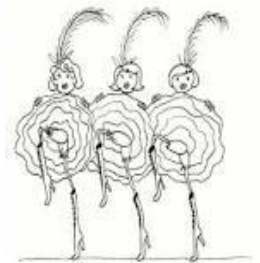
