Dear Parish Family:

We can't live without trusting can we? We trust many people and many things every day. Simple things, like, the traffic lights are working properly as we make a mad dash for work, we trust that the surgeon knows what he or she is doing when we undergo an operation and for me, I trust that my Keurig works for that first cup of coffee in the morning. We can't live without trust.

When it comes to people, we don't think about trust too much when our relationships are going well. Our wife, husband or friends have proved they are trustworthy, we then feel comfortable entrusting them with our thoughts and feelings. But when something happens in that relationship and we feel betrayed, we then know how difficult it is to reestablish trust with them. We are hesitant and do not want to take a chance on being hurt again.

When it comes to our relationship with God, it's hard to overestimate the importance of trust. Our readings today encourage us to deepen our trust in God. Abraham was given the ultimate test. He was to sacrifice his only son. Abraham was asked to trust in a situation where it looked like foolishness to obey. Abraham was asked to detach himself from what he loved most to show that he trusted God more than anything on earth.

St. Paul says; "With God on our side, who can be against us?" Everyone can say, God is on my side, he is there to hear me, help me, wants the best for me. God wants to assure us that in the end there is, in fact, nothing to fear, not even death, we will all share in being transfigured as Jesus was. But just as we find it easy to trust others when things are going well, and not so easy when we feel betrayed, so often we have the same experience with God. Our trust in God will not necessarily solve our problems. But it will enable us to put them in perspective, the perspective of our faith.

As we continue on our Lenten journey, let us pray that we may continue to develop our trust in the God who will always be on our side, now and forever.....
