Dear Parish Family:

Alleluia --- Alleluia---Alleluia---
Christ is Risen!!!

There is a story told of an older priest who celebrated the Easter Vigil for the first time in English. He was doing very well, almost to the end of the service, without a hitch. In those days, near the end of the liturgy there was an antiphon that was to be sung in Gregorian chant by the celebrant. The words in Latin were "Et Valde Mane" when translated means "and very early in the morning." The choir was to respond to the antiphon. The priest looked at the Latin and thought a moment while the choir waited anxiously. Then in a strong voice he sang, "oh what a beautiful morning."

Actually, that's not a bad proclamation of what this morning is. The song we know is from the play OKLAHOMA and goes "oh what a beautiful day." I've got a wonderful feeling, everything's going my way.

O' what a beautiful, glorious day, let us walk with the newness of this life, so that everything will always be going our way. O' yes, what a beautiful morning, the Lord is risen, alleluia, alleluia alleluia!!
