3rd Sunday after Easter

Dear Parish Family:

Several years ago, there was a great fascination with ghosts. People like to think and talk about ghosts. Even the movies had the famous "Ghost-Busters", a story of a group of men who were in the ghost capturing business. As kids, we remember the famous Saturday morning cartoon, "Casper" the friendly ghost. Children like to dress up as ghosts on Halloween. But for the most of us, a ghost is some amorphous figure in white or an invisible spirit.

Our gospel today is about a ghost. The first to see this ghost was the disciples on the road to Emmaus. But they recognized him in the breaking of the bread and then he vanished from their sight.

We have a tendency to live two lives, the spiritual and the daily living of our lives. We also divide Jesus into two parts. Jesus has saved our spiritual life, but many times, he has nothing to say about our daily living. But sometimes, Jesus comes back to haunt us. He did not come just to save us but taught us how to live. We can turn Jesus into a ghost when we engage in manipulation. When we try to destroy another's reputation or not allow another to exercise their individuality. Another way too, is when we become possessive. The early Church sold all and supported the poor. In another Gospel story, we hear Jesus telling the rich man to sell all then follow. Jesus never said to own things. There is a difference between possessing things and being possessed by them.

The no-need-to-reform-attitude is in another way to turn Jesus into a ghost. This attitude fosters the idea that we are perfect. We know it all. We do not need to follow rules. We are too busy with other things. Jesus always stresses the need for reform. Unless, we really try to make efforts, Jesus is still a ghost and not the real substance of my life.

Jesus didn't come to haunt us! He came to life to tell us that He is real and not just a figment of our imagination. He is continuously telling us in our modern day language, "get with it", or "get our

act together" and to unite our faith with our daily living too.

Jesus comes and stands by us today, not as a ghost, but in the flesh and blood in the Eucharist we will share together. He calls us to believe in Him, to live His way, to approach His table to break bread and to seek the strength needed to live His way always.

Our St. Barnabas Boy Scout Troop #76 will be having a pancake breakfast on April 22, 2018 in Brennan Hall. All proceeds of the breakfast will go for sending the boys to Summer Camp. Come enjoy a delicious breakfast and in turn help our Scouts.
