4th Sunday after Easter

Dear Parish Family:

If God in His infinite wisdom had chosen for His Son Jesus to be born in 1950 rather than 2000 years ago, we would I'm sure have an entirely different group of parables being told by Jesus in 2018. Jesus used easily recognizable, everyday sights, events and experiences as the basis of His parables. If told today for the first time, some of these stories illustrating truth would be different, e.g. the parable of the talents might be the parable of the stockbroker; the parable of the workers in the vineyard, would be the parable of the labor negotiator.

Today's parable of the Good Shepherd for those who first heard it, knew how and why a shepherd carried out his tasks of responsibility to the safety and prosperity of his flock. If this story had been told this year, it might have emerged as the parable of the pre-school teacher, the parable of the little league coach or the parable of the scout leader or den mother. Drawing on the experiences of these people, we can picture them keeping three year olds together on a class trip, car-pooling a team to an away game or taking the scouts on a hiking trip, we can begin to understand the parable of Jesus as the Good Shepherd.

Jesus lays down his life for his flock. He chose to accept death on the cross for us. Jesus desires for all of us, His sheep, to be gathered into one flock. When He died, Jesus did not leave the flock to scatter, but appointed new shepherds, the apostles, to maintain and increase the flock. We aid in this by; lovingly encouraging those who have left the Church to look again at their choice. Another way is by trying to be peacemakers in all areas of family life. Also, encouraging one another to support the Church's teaching on moral issues that separate the sheep from the shepherd.

Being called to be shepherds, helping to lead others to Jesus can be a difficult task. We cannot give up. We cannot become discouraged. We must

continue allowing ourselves to be shepherds by the example of the Good Shepherd. In the Eucharist we receive, we celebrate the Good Shepherd's laying down His life for the flock and let us rejoice always that we belong to this flock now and for all of eternity.

Congratulations to all our little ones who received their First Holy Communion. It's always a special time for their families and for our parish. Thanks to all their teachers and assistants who helped to prepare them for this great Sacrament. We will again have First Communion Masses next Saturday, April 28th at 9am and 12 Noon. All parishioners are welcome to join us as the little ones come to the Lord's table for the first time.

Our nurse's ministry is sponsoring a blood pressure screening next weekend after all the Masses in the meeting room. Come in and have your blood pressure checked. It's a great way of preventing any major complications from happening. What a valuable service they provide for us and we are most grateful to them.

On Sunday, May 6th at 2:00 p.m., we will have our annual May Crowning. It's a beautiful tradition in honoring our Blessed Mother. I invite all of our parishioners to come and join us on that day.
