5th Sunday after Easter

Dear Parish Family:

I remember one day talking to an elderly parishioner. I asked him: "John, I suppose at your age 100, you are probably thinking about the hereafter?" You bet, Father, I think about the hereafter all the time. No matter where I am, in the parlor, in the bedroom, in the kitchen, or down in the basement, I ask myself, "**Now what am I here after?**"

The late Henri Nouwen, a famous Catholic writer, once said, "can Christians speak of a "hereafter" to a world which hardly has any faith in a here and now?" How can we proclaim God's kingdom of peace and love, healing and reconciliation to a people whose experiences makes them believe no such things are possible?

Jesus faces the same dilemma in today's gospel as he tries to speak to his friends of the "hereafter." The disciples have grown up in a land crushed under Roman government. They have seen their religious leaders divided between what was right and what was wrong. They saw rebellious Jews stretched in agony on Roman crosses. Now, they meet Jesus, their faith in the here and now begins to rise, until resistance to him began to mount on all sides.

Yet Jesus says, "I am the way, the truth and the life." The mystery of faith that we proclaim in the Eucharist is that "Christ has died, Christ is risen and Christ will come again" is the essence of our belief. We are people of the Resurrection, the hereafter people. We believe in the agony of loss, the horror of war, the cruelty of injustice will all be reversed beyond the grave in the hereafter. But the hereafter still lies ahead of us. Like the disciples, we must first have to live the here and at times the here can be frightening and that's why we need to follow Jesus, our way to the brightness of the hereafter.

As we gather Sunday after Sunday to celebrate the Eucharist, let us remember that we

share in the broken body and outpoured blood of our crucified Lord as we journey day after with one foot in the here and now and looking forward to the eternal banquet He has prepared for us in the hereafter.

Our Annual May Crowning will take place on Sunday, May 6th at 2:00 p.m. in the Church. We invite all our parishioners to come and join with our First Holy Communicants as we, the parish family crown our Blessed Mother.

St. Barnabas BAT's will be having their annual Mother's Day flower sale on Sunday, May 13th at all the Masses. What a great way to express our love and thanks to our mothers by giving her flowers on this special day.

Thursday, May 10th is the Feast of the Ascension of Our Lord. **It's is a Holyday of Obligation.** Our Mass schedule is as follows: Wednesday, May 9th at 7:00 p.m. and on the Holy day itself, May 10th the Masses are at 8:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. All Masses are held in the Church.

We are moving very well in achieving our goal of \$90,000.00 to this year's Catholic Annual Appeal. So far, 275 Donors have graciously pledged \$44,271.00 bringing us up to 49% of our goal. Once again, I ask all those who haven't made a pledge yet, to give some prayerful thought in considering making a pledge. Remember, big or small whatever you can do will be greatly appreciated. Pledge cards are available at the Church's exits and also at the rectory office during business hours. As always, I'm most grateful to you for your kindness and generosity.

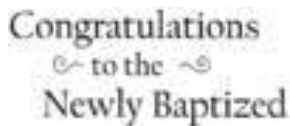

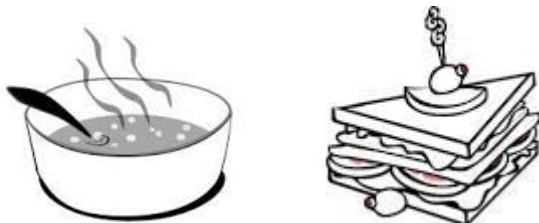
