## Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity

Dear Parish Family:

How many times of we heard our children say, “You don’t understand me?” or maybe teachers admitting that they don’t understand their students. How about husbands and wives who feel that their spouses don’t really understand each other?

Today is Trinity Sunday. As we learned years ago, the Trinity is a mystery of our faith. Even the greatest minds of history have tried to help us understand, but as we know, a mystery is a mystery. St. Augustine was the first to try and explain the Trinity. One day as he was thinking about the Trinity, he was walking along the seashore. He met a little girl who was dipping water out of the sea and pouring it into a little hole she made in the sand. St. Augustine asked her what she was doing. The girl replied, “I’m going to put the sea into that little hole. St. Augustine said, “that’s impossible!” The little girl looked up at the Saint and said, “It is easier to put the sea into this little hole than for you to understand the Holy Trinity.”

So if we can’t understand the mystery of the Trinity, let’s look at it from the meaning of the Trinity in our life. Our whole life is affected by the Trinity. We are baptized into the Trinity. We begin and end each Mass in the name of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit. All throughout the Mass we recall this great mystery, in the Gloria, the Creed and in the major prayers, the opening prayer; the prayer over the gifts and after Holy Communion. Our liturgy never lets us forget that we are children of the Trinity, that the life of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit is our life and always lives in us.

We all have been blessed with many gifts and talents which when used properly, helps us to grow more in the image and likeness of God. When we experience this goodness, we are assured of the life we share with God now until the day we share it fully in His kingdom.

Another simpler way of understanding the meaning of the Trinity especially when making the sign of the cross: “The Father, who created me, + the Son who redeemed me, + the Holy Spirit that sanctifies me. Amen.”

Our Annual Memorial Day Mass will be celebrated on Monday, May 28<sup>th</sup> at 9:00 a.m. What a beautiful way to remember the many sacrifices of our men and women who answered the call of our nation to help protect the gift of freedom for all of us. 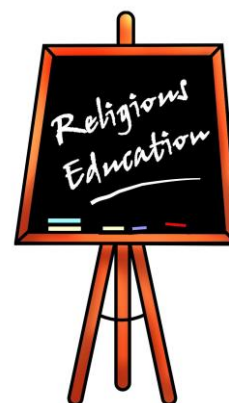
