11th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Dear Parish Family:

“So whether we are at home or away, we make it our aim to please him. For all of us must appear before the judgement seat of Christ, so that each one may receive recompense for what has been done in the body, whether good or evil.” These words are from today’s second reading.

There seems to be a great reluctance on the part of many Christians to talk about the idea of judgement. It seems like people have this insidious idea that it doesn’t matter what we do in this life, because God would never pass judgement on us that would require any sort of punishment. Many people have this notion that God has a big book or a fast computer where he tracks all the good and bad thing we do. Then on judgement day, God asks for a print-out. If the good outweighs the evil, we go to heaven. If there is little too much evil, we go to purgatory and if there is nothing but total evil, then we take a trip to the unmentionable place.

God doesn’t keep a score card. He looks into our hearts to see if we are sincere in making him a part of our lives. He sees if we are truly following His commandments and putting them with love into action each day. Our daily decisions are the way we create judgement for ourselves. We form them by the choices we make. Whatever we choose or decide on we must always face the end results.

So it is with our spiritual life. Our decision to love or not to love, to give ourselves or to withhold, to be forgiving or to hold grudges, to be compassionate or to have a stone cold heart, all these and many more are the judgements that we make upon ourselves. Remember, “after all is said and done, in the evening of life, we shall be judged on love,” words by St. John of the Cross.

Here’s something to think about: “If you were to stand before God today, what do you think your verdict would be???”

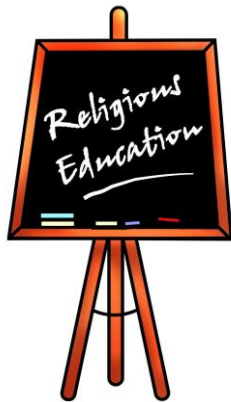
