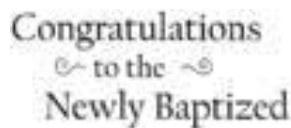

Dear Parish Family:

People who suffer from an incurable illness can become so desperate that they are willing to try anything and everything. In today's Gospel, we hear of a woman who was suffering from a hemorrhage for twelve years. After many disappointments, she approached Jesus, for she had nothing to lose. Did this woman really have "faith" in Jesus? Or was it superstition, thinking that her real interest was in Jesus' power. "If I but touch his clothes, I shall be cured." She wasn't thinking, "If I just have faith in God, I shall get well." It would seem that she had more superstition than faith.

How different faith is from superstition. Faith is trust in a person. It is the opposite of fear. Superstition bids us to rely on a power that we believe can harm us if handled incorrectly and in most cases, superstition leads us to fear. It's interesting how Jesus treats this woman. He does not scold her, but he encourages her, "Daughter, your faith has saved you." Jesus treats her as if she had faith, when it is likely she had little more than superstition. She came to know that where faith fills the heart, there's little room for fear.

How many of us grew up with a strange vision of fear? Some fear God as a stern judge waiting to punish us severely for the slightest infraction of rules. What do you fear? We all fear something and the something we fear changes as we journey through life.

It is in our celebration of the Eucharist that Jesus invites us to cast our fears away and be filled with faith. And when we do, we touch the one who is able to do, in us and through us, not merely the unexpected, not merely the impossible, but even the impossible.

Remember the words of Jesus "Do not be afraid, just have faith."

Our Vacation Bible School is fast approaching. If you haven't registered your children yet, now is the time to do so. Registration can be

done at the Religious Education Office during the scheduled hours. It's a great week, filled with so many activities and opportunities for children to get to know each other too. Don't delay, register today!

HOST AN EXCHANGE STUDENT

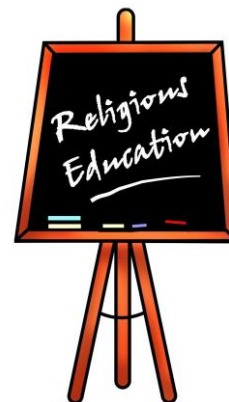
