15th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Dear Parish Family:

This is the season for vacations. People are traveling, across country, visiting family and friends. No matter what kind of a vacation one takes, no one can avoid packing a bag or a suitcase. What looks simple usually turns out complicated as people attempt to organize a variety of items into a suitcase.

In today's Gospel, Jesus tells the apostles not to take a suitcase with them. He is sending them out two by two, but not on a vacation, but on a vocation journey. The mission of their journey is to spread the Good News. They are instructed to take no food, no traveling bag, no money; no change of clothes, just the clothes and sandals on their feet and a walking staff is all that is needed. Their task was to preach the need of repentance, to expel demons, to anoint the sick and to work many cures.

St. Paul reminds us today that we too have been chosen by Jesus to take a working vacation like the disciples. He said, "**God chose us in Christ before the world began in Him we were chosen and sealed with the Holy Spirit.**" We are chosen by Jesus to be His disciples and to continue the work He began. Being a disciple means living the life of one. Just look around you each day, there are so many challenges that face us, challenges like, poverty, injustice, hunger, apathy, boredom. These were some of the areas that the disciples had to deal with and they are still the same areas that we have to deal with at the present time. On the other hand, there are other areas that can be more adaptable and challenging for us. For example, a visit to a sick relative, friend or neighbor, looking after them, checking daily on their needs, maybe taking a lonely person out for a short ride or visiting someone in the nursing home, all of these are things that can truly accomplish the mission Jesus is asking of us.

There is a difference between living Catholicism and practicing Catholicism.

Sometimes we don't want to hear about these things, not to mention being the person who lives this way. The question is which one of the two are we living out in following the message of Jesus, who came to serve and not to be served?
