24th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Dear Parish Family:

When we speak, we use words. Words carry positive feelings like, "Yes, mother, love and enthusiasm." Then there are other words that denote negative feelings like, "No, unemployment, hijacking, terrorism." Then there are neutral words like, "the, for and if." They invoke no particular feeling.

Our readings are filled with strong negative words like, "rebelled, beat, plucked, buffet, spitting and shame." Jesus uses strong words like, "suffer, rejected, death, Satan, deny, cross and lose life." How do we react to all of these negative words? Maybe we are like St. Peter; he preferred using "positive or neutral" words. For example, it is easier to say "Jesus is the Messiah, if we believe in Jesus, but there is more to it than words. St. James says, "What good is it to profess faith without practicing it?" Demonstrating faith by works really shows what we believe in. By the way we live, the decisions we make, the moral code we follow, all shows, "Faith without works is worthless."

In our culture today, the tendency is to "indulge." To profess faith in Jesus is to be willing to accept rejections, especially in areas of our lives, places where we socialize, not always following the crowds. Our world says to bend our values, anything goes, if it feels good do it. Yes, like St. Peter, we just want to say "Jesus is the Messiah" and that's good enough. Like St. Peter, Jesus tells us "if you wish to follow me, take up my cross." We must be willing to follow the Lord in all ways, there are, no "short cuts, no easy way out, no other systems."

So, let us push through all the negativism that surrounds our world today and look to the "positive side," that there is one word that can help us, that is "resurrection." This one word can make all the difference in our lives. Amen.

RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS (RCIA)

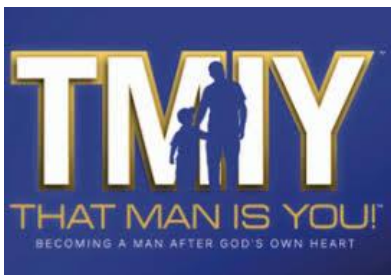
