Dear Parish Family:

I'm sure all of us remember from our history classes the "Caste-system" in India. It's the social grouping of people. A person born into a particular group remains there all life-long. In South Africa, it's called "Apartheid." Apartheid is a policy of segregation, political and economic discrimination. Before 1960, United States had segregation; certain ethnic backgrounds had their own schools, churches, jobs, etc. Within our society today, we still have such grouping. We call it "Status," usually, based on one's income. We all want to be important and be recognized as being important. Who is more important? That's the question in today's gospel.

The disciples were arguing this point among themselves. Jesus, as usual turned their ideas upside down. He says, "If anyone wants to rank first, he must be the last of all and the servant of all." Jesus' point is that there is no such thing as status among his followers. Everyone is equal. In the sight of God, it's not social status, wealth, or reputation that counts. In fact, these are obstacles in establishing a relationship with God.

If we want to find Jesus, we can begin to live His teaching today, by changing our attitudes towards others, developing good ways of living. Volunteering time and talents, being helpful to someone, these are some ways, but there are many other ways we can offer ourselves as followers of Jesus. Jesus did away with status, caste-systems, apartheid and importance, why because in God's eyes we are all equal. "If anyone wishes to rank first, so who wants to be first????"
