26<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time

Dear Parish Family:

At one time or another in our lives all of us have had the experience of being “left out.” As kids, we may have been left out of games, being the person no one wanted on their team, we were always the last ones to be chosen. As teenagers, we may have found ourselves not receiving an invitation to a party, or a date for the prom or being left out when no one would tell us what everyone else took to be common knowledge. As adults, we may have felt left out when we did not get the job or the position we wanted or the loan fell through for the house, or the car we wanted is too expensive. Many elderly feel left out when some go on a trip and others must remain in the nursing home.

In our Gospel today, we find a man who was not a part of the inner circle of disciples. Not only is the man not a disciple of Jesus but the man is using Jesus’ name to heal the sick, or as referred to as “expelling demons. “ St. John is telling Jesus, “Teacher, we saw a man using your name to expel demons and we tried to stop him because he is not of our company.” What’s interesting in this Gospel is that those outside the “circle” exercise the same spiritual power as those within the circle. The suggestion here is that “Spiritual power or faith can be exercised by anyone.” God works as God wills, where God wills and how God wills. No one can confine God to just one way of life. Like Moses in our first reading and Jesus in our Gospel today, we are called to develop our faith in new and different ways. In our own lives, we can find plenty of ways in which we can give of ourselves in volunteering in various programs within the Church or within our community. The circle in ways we can exercise our talents is big enough for all. All we have to do to become a part of that circle is grow more intimately with the Lord each day. It’s a challenge, but one that can be accomplished.

We are starting up another Altar Server training session for those who are interested in

serving at the Altar. Sessions begin on Tuesday, October 2<sup>nd</sup>, and continue for the next two Tuesdays. To register, please contact Tim Blumensteel at 732-237-0791.
