29th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Dear Parish Family:

Support groups are thriving. More and more are forming each day. There are groups for widows and widowers, divorced and separated, grieving, alcoholics, mentally challenged, young parents and retired persons. The numbers are growing because people need help. In these groups, one talks over their problems with others who have experienced the same, thus these groups give the strength and encouragement to one who is struggling with it.

In our second reading today, we are told that Jesus is one who has suffered all that we have suffered and has made it through. He sympathizes with our weakness. He was tempted in every way we are but did not sin. Jesus certainly understands our pains. He knew rejection; His own townspeople tried to throw him off a cliff. He understands when we are ignored. He was betrayed by his friends. Judas used a kiss, a sign of love, to betray him. Some of us know the pains of being USED by someone else, or one who made a mockery of our love. Jesus was the object of slander. The Pharisees accused him of being in a league with the devil when driving out demons. They accused him of blasphemy, twisting his words. When we have been hurt by gossip, backbiting, being accused falsely, it's comforting to know that Jesus understands.

There are other experiences that Jesus encountered. He knew the pain of being poor, the pain of failure, and the struggles of temptation and the pain of loneliness. Jesus shares our human hurts. His heart is full of love and compassion. In Jesus, the cross cannot be separated from the crown. That is what Jesus was trying to say to James and John today. If we come to Christ, he will be a comfort and support in bearing our crosses. He will strengthen us in our weakness, be our joy in suffering and our refuge when our crosses seem unbearable.

He does all this because He loves us. What great support group to be in, don't you think so?

It's hard to believe that Christmas is just 65 days away from today. Christmas is a very special time of the year, especially as we want to remember a loved one who has passed away. What a great way to remember a loved one by having a lovely Christmas ornament designed as a lifetime gift.
