30th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Dear Parish Family:

There's one experience that most of us do not like, that is the experience of being in the dark. Can you remember the last time you found yourself in total darkness? Maybe some of us felt confusion, being in a dark room, you didn't know what direction to go. Or maybe we felt afraid, even to take the next step. Being in the dark is not a pleasant experience; it can be very frightening and confusing.

In our Gospel, the beggar is one who is blind. His is in the dark all the time. In the scriptures, physical blindness is often used to symbolize a spiritual blindness or state of confusion. Bartimaeus represents each of us in our confusion. For example, we may be in a difficult relationship that is not going as it should, and we don't know which way to go. Or our marriage may be in deep trouble and we are getting more depressed about it but feel stuck. Or life may not be going the way we thought it would, and we are confused about any decisions for the future. There can be many more situations that bring confusion into our lives.

If we follow the example of Bartimaeus, the thing to do is call out to Jesus. Why, because in our confusion we never seek the wisdom that is available, we keep ourselves hidden, not wanting to be exposed for fear of what others may think about us. Some of us never want to admit that we can be in a confused state. So we love to cover it up.

In our Gospel, we hear "So throwing off his cloak, he sprang up and came to Jesus." Bartimaeus threw off his cloak. He uncovered himself. He exposed his problem and then sprang up, took action, made a decision and went to the one he knew could help him.

St. Ignatius of Loyola gives us some important advice about what to do and what not to do when we find ourselves in confusion. He says, "Never make a decision when we are seriously

confused." Seek Christ through prayer, seek advice and counsel, be patient and open to the healing that sometimes comes slowly. Have trust that God will not leave us alone, but will come to us precisely at that point where we need God the most. Bartimaeus experience this, so let's be like Bartimaeus, let's not walk in darkness, but rather follow the light that leads to the peace and joy we wish to experience.

Thursday, November 1st is the Feast of All Saints. It's a holyday of obligation. Mass schedule is as follows: Wednesday, October 31st the Vigil at 7:00 p.m. and on the holyday itself, Masses are at 8 a.m. and 5:00 p.m.

Our Rectory Offices will be closed on Thursday, November 1st in observance of All Saints Day.

Thought for the week; from the Christopher's notes: "It's better to light one candle, than to curse the darkness."

Have a good week; we'll see you in Church.....
