33<sup>rd</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time

Dear Parish Family:

The old-time preachers used to love these scriptural readings depicting the end of the world and the end of one's personal life in this world. Somewhere there was a picture show of a corpse lying in front of a parking meter with the message, "Time Expired." Someday the parking meter of our lives will read, "Time Expired," and there are no exceptions.

In our readings today, we hear the familiar words, "you know neither the day nor the hour; death comes like a thief in the night." So, since we do not know the hour, we must be "always prepared." I guess there is a certain value in using this kind of language. It makes one think (hopefully for a moment) to consider seriously the meaning of life and above all the goal of life.

But I wonder if that is what Jesus really wants of us, to be scared into conversion. I think Jesus wants us to know that God is present to us in His creation, in our daily work, the pains, the sorrows and the joys. I think Jesus wants us to do our best to live this life fully, with love and thoughtfulness, to know that he is in charge of the world. He wants us to place our hope in Him and to desire Him in our lives.

There is so much talk about finding the meaning of life today. For many people, life has no meaning; they just exist; they endure life; they do not actually live it. Jesus says, "Stand erect, lift up your heads, for your deliverance is at hand." In other words, look up, look around you, discover Christ in your life, rejoice in His presence, take courage, and never give up hope, because the God of hope will never abandon those whom He loves, those who love Him, who trust in Him.

The message is so simple: Death is coming. Time will expire. But for those who learn to live fully, who learn to love, to share themselves with others, need have no fear. Why? Because they will know the meaning of the words: "it is good for me

to be with the Lord, and put my hope in Him. Amen."

Our annual Thanksgiving Day Mass will be this Thursday, November 22<sup>nd</sup> at 9:00 a.m. in the Church. What a beautiful way to start the holiday by coming to Church and to give thanks to God for the many blessing we have received and the blessings yet to come in our lives.

We are pleased to announce that on the second Sunday of the month at the 10:30am Mass, we will be offering the Children's Liturgy of the Word program here at St. Barnabas!

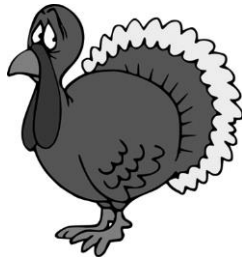
