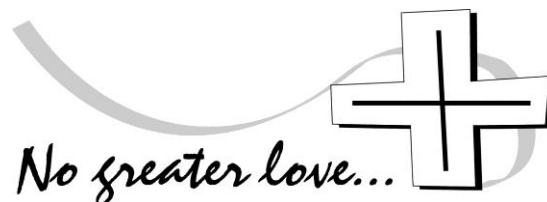

Feast of Christ the King

Today, our Church draws to close another liturgical year on a somber note with a gospel scene from Good Friday. Jesus stands on trial before Pilate accused of being a king. With death staring him in the face, his reply is crystal clear. He admits to be a king, but not in recognizable worldly manner of kingship. Christ is a spiritual leader, who rules by truth and love. He is out to touch the hearts and minds of all people and claim their souls for God. His mission on earth is to unfold a vision of a new world, to announce the Good News that God counts us family, regards us as his children and in return seeks our allegiance. By the way we live, we declare where our loyalties lie.

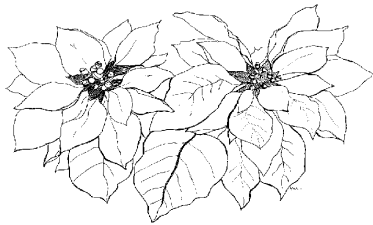

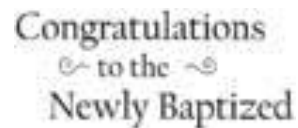

VOLUNTEERS NEEDED FOR FREE INCOME TAX PREPARATION TO ALL WHO NEED HELP

Free Income Tax preparation is available to anyone who needs help with filing their Federal and N J taxes with special attention given to seniors. Additional volunteers are needed to work in the program and to help in the preparation of electronically filed tax returns. Volunteers must attend approximately 3 days of training during December and 10 days during January, from 9am to 2pm. All classes are held at St. Mary's of the Pine on McKinley Blvd in Manahawkin. Volunteers are required to be able, at least, one half-day beginning February 1 to April 15, 2019. This is an AARP program in cooperation with the IRS and NJ Division of Taxation.
