## Baptism of Our Lord

Dear Parish Family:

All of us are familiar with masks. A mask is a “false face,” an appearance; a front. The purpose of a mask is to impress people and, at times to conceal the true identity of the person behind the mask.

Our Gospel today, portrays Jesus as being unmasked by God. St. Luke tells us that “the people were full of the anticipation, wondering in their hearts whether John might be the Messiah.” In order to get it all straightened out, God unmasked Jesus before His own people. A voice came from the heaven; “You are my beloved Son, on you my favor rests.”

It’s a common thing, that all of us put on “false faces” in order to conceal our true identity. We sometimes play the Long Ranger when we wear the mask of “shyness.” “I am nobody special; do not expect much from me.” Another mask may be dedication. “I am a solid citizen, a moral person, a person of principles. Obedience is another mask some of us wear. “I am ready and willing. I am available. It does not matter what I do so long as I can be useful.”

But then, there are the other masks we often wear like “bitterness.” “Stand clear of me, I can see through everyone. Back off bozo! Either deal with me on my terms or not at all.” Complaining is an interesting mask. “I don’t like this or that. I don’t like the way you look or what you wear.” This can be a popular mask among us. All of these masks, and others, can say one thing, “I don’t want to grow. I do not want to change. I do not want to become what God wants me to be.”

Some day we will meet God face to face. If we have lived the life of the servant that we have been called to be through baptism, we can approach God without a mask and He will readily recognize us and invite us to the Eucharist that lasts forever. If we have lived our lives with mask, however, He will probably say to us “Excuse me? Have we ever

met? I do not think I know you.” The door will be closed in front of our masked faces. Then, to those on the other side of the door, those seeing God face to face, He will say: “Who were those masked people?”

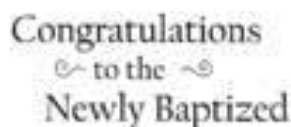

### 2018 NEW JERSEY TAX AMNESTY

The Division of Taxation has been authorized to implement a tax amnesty program, providing taxpayers with the opportunity to file past tax returns and/or pay back taxes along with only half of the interest due as of November 1, 2018. The amnesty will ONLY apply to outstanding tax filings or payments that are reportable on a tax return due on or after February 1, 2009, and prior to September 1, 2017. The 2018 NJ Tax Amnesty will end on January 15, 2019.
