QUESTIONS OF THE WEEK

Children: St. Paul tells us that all gifts are good because they all are different but come from the same God. How do you feel when someone else has a gift you'd like to have? How can you find and share your gift?



2nd Sunday in Ordinary Time

Dear Parish Family:

I often wonder, why did Jesus choose a wedding feast as the place for his first miracle? It seems like such an unlikely choice for a “first miracle.” Why not perform a rising from the dead or the cure of a leper as a first miracle? That would surely have caught the attention of the people in a more dramatic way. Over the years, many writers tried to explain the reasoning of this miracle. The changing of the water into wine could be used to think about many different situations in our lives.

God draws us throughout our lives to pleasure. There is pleasure in friendship and love, in families, pleasure in eating (my favorite) and sharing, pleasure of nature, or even in worship, in music and silence. And where does this all come from? Well, from God. He is the creator of all good things. But then on the other hand, there are “not so good” pleasures. They do not lead us to God, but rather away from God and others. For example, pleasures in the hoarding of possessions, pornographic materials, promiscuity, gluttony, violence, etc. This kind of pleasure is always at the expense of another person. When I act selfishly, refusing to share with those in need, then my pleasure is without conscience. Someone else suffers because of what I want to enjoy.

Pleasure is a large part of our lives. Each day, we are pushed and pulled by pleasure; we struggle to turn away from those things that often leave us empty or guilty. Let’s remember, pleasure is not something that God is asking us to avoid. It’s God’s way of calling us forward in life.

Remember, the good pleasures we choose here, will only be a foretaste of what God has in store for us. Let us be thankful for all the good things that God has given us that will continue to draw us to him and to one another.

invite all our little ones to come and join us as we celebrate the Mass.

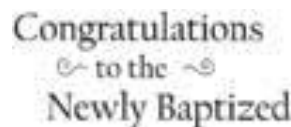
