3rd Sunday in Ordinary Time

Dear Parish Family:

Every one of us has an identity. We identify ourselves by what we do or by what we own. For example, in our wallets or purses we have something that identifies who we are like a picture of ourselves or a driver's license or identification card. Having an identity is unique for each of us; there is no one who is exactly like us.

Besides having a personal identity, we also have a family identity. Every one of us belongs to a family. Photo albums are a great source of our identity in playing an important part of our family life. We also have an ecclesial identity. By ecclesial, I mean that we belong to a particular church community. All of us are members of St. Barnabas Catholic Church. This identity distinguishes us from other Catholics in our city, state and country.

St. Paul in his letter to the Corinthians was trying to give some identity to the Church at Corinth. He uses the analogy of the body with its members as an example. Just like the hands, the ears, eyes, nose and feet all share an equal importance to the body, so too, does the members of the church have an important part of building up the body of Christ. We belong to this body by our baptism. Even though we are unique, yet we are needed for the church to grow.

Unfortunately, our society today can draw us away from this important aspect of our identity as Church. It continually calls us to get ahead for self, be successful for self, make more money for self, and be beautiful for self. This mentality is many times carried over in our church, for example, "I do not get anything out of the Mass. I do not like the priest or deacons. I do not like the way the church is arranged, I do like the songs we sing." Besides being petty, these statements reflect the individuality which our world projects today.

There is no room for dissension in the body of Christ; all the members are to be concerned about

the greatest good for the whole body. As members of this body, we either build it up using the gifts given us, or we can tear it down by selfishly possessing those gifts. We are one body with Christ as our head. We form His body now and always.

Next weekend, February 3rd, we will have the annual blessing of throats in memory of St. Blasé'. The blessing will take place immediately following the Mass.

Also, next Saturday and Sunday, following the Masses, we will have a reception for Fr. Carlos in celebration of him becoming a citizen of the United States. After each Mass, Father will be in Brennan Hall, where you can come and personally give your best wishes to him and enjoy some light refreshments.

Your generosity in the maintenance collection has helped us to purchase, new shoes for our snow plow, industrial salt spreader, (hopefully we won't have to use them much) new and tamper proof thermostats in Father Brennan Hall, industrial paint for the pantry floor and later on the walls in the pantry and recently, a new heavy wooden door between the meeting room and kitchen in Father Brennan Hall. Once we get into the warmer months, there are several projects, like a new tile floor in Rucki Hall, new carpet squares for the rectory office, and looking to get an estimate for a new heating and air conditioning unit for the church which will be needed soon. I am very grateful to your constant support in the maintenance collection.
