5<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time

Dear Parish Family:

I have some objects that represent attitudes found in our world today. For example, “T.V. Remote Control.” It represents “**Comfort**.” All of us desire comfort. This item helps us not get up from our chairs to change the channel, raise or lower the volume, or turn it off or on, and now these days, we can use our voices to tell what channel we desire. Another example: “Blank Contract.” A blank contract represents “**Decision**.” Once we have decided to buy something, we will fill in the blanks and then put our signature on the bottom line. Our signature shows that we have definitely reached a decision. A “Tennis Ball”. The tennis ball represents the “**Competition**” that takes place in our world today. So, we use the contract to decide to buy a television with a remote control for comfort so that we watch the sports competition represented by this tennis ball.

Comfort, Decision, Competition, all three attitudes are found in our world today. In Jesus’ day there existed the same attitudes. The only differences were that there were different objects representing these attitudes. For example; If the fishing boat were moored by the lake, the fishermen were taking some “comfort.” “Master, we have been hard at it all night long.” “Decision” was represented by tossing the nets into the lake. This was not an easy task. The nets were large and heavy and required a number of men to lower and raise them up again. There also was competition, not only did the fishermen go fishing for food, but they were in competition with each other for their livelihood. **Comfort, Decision and Competition**, however, were given away once Simon, James and John were amazed at their catch, they brought their boats to shore and left everything and became Jesus’ followers.

Jesus invites us to leave everything behind. But so often, we have a very difficult time doing that in order to follow Him. We are too

comfortable, we are afraid to decide, so often we would prefer someone else make certain decisions for us. Jesus walks into our world and invites us to walk the path with Him. If we follow Him, Jesus promises us that we will always find our way through the difficulties of this life, to the life He promises us one day. But it’s only if we are willing to take the challenge seriously. Let us keep trying to put on the attitude of Jesus in making the necessary changes in our lives. That’s all that the Lord expects from us and if we do, Jesus tells us not to be afraid for “I am with you always.” How comforting, how encouraging, how good is the Lord to us.

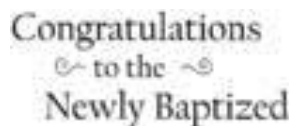

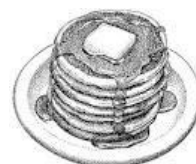
