Dear Parish Family:

More than 200 years ago, a group of colonial men decided to revolt. In the minds of the English, these men were rebels. The revolutionaries, however, were non-conformists who searched for a new way of doing old things.

Jesus was non-conformist, who saw a need for a change. He turned a lot of things upside down. The Beatitudes we hear in today's gospel, are the reversals of all the values by which we live by today. What Jesus blesses, we try to avoid. For example: "Blessed are you poor"---because you are honest and the sharks of this world feed upon you. The poor stand in lines at soup kitchens for food or in shelters for a bed to sleep on. They are poor, they are blessed. "Blessed are you who are weeping"---because you are gentle and get trampled by the ruthless. The widow looks for support as she grieves her lost spouse. The parents of a lost or kidnapped child are weeping. Blessed are the weeping, they shall laugh. "Blessed are you who are persecuted"---because the standards you live by are far different from the worlds. Your reward will be great in heaven.

Jesus also challenges those who are rich, those who live lavish lives, those who think everything is a big joke in the world; those who speak well of you, be careful, many times others will deceive you and bring false accusations against you. All of these words of Jesus might make us feel uncomfortable especially when we listen to them and then try to rationalize our ways out of the confrontation they bring. Jesus calls us into question. He challenges us to examine our values, to look upon whom our lives are really centered. He tells us that our search for happiness and peace are worthless in comparison to what he offers. His words do not exalt hunger and poverty into virtues; neither do they recommend unhappiness as the clue to the meaning of life. But Jesus says, blessed are the people who need, who need him, instead of

themselves. These words of Jesus today can be dead words if they remain hidden in a book and only heard on Sunday. They can become living words only when we recognize and utilize them in our daily lifestyle. Then, only then, can we become true followers, true revolutionaries, like our leader, Jesus Christ.

Our nurse's ministry will be having their monthly blood pressure screening next weekend, February 23<sup>rd</sup> and 24<sup>th</sup> after all the Masses. Stop in and have your blood pressure taken, it's a great way to keep healthy and avoid any problems. We thank our nurses for providing this great opportunity.

Also, next weekend is our monthly Children's Mass at 10:30 a.m. We invite all our children to come and join in celebrating with us at Mass.

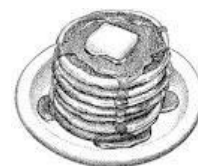
