7<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time

Dear Parish Family:

One of the first activities most of us do in the morning is to look at ourselves in the mirror. What do we see? Some gray hair, an unshaven face, blood-shot eyes, a crooked nose, etc. The mirror cannot lie when it comes to an outward appearance; it can only reflect what is in front of it. The mirror reflects a mortal and corruptible body. The mirror reflects our human state of life. A life that is weak and imperfect. For some of us, the hardest thing for us to admit is that we are imperfect and are in need of help.

When we were baptized, we were told that we could have our image changed so that it would reflect Jesus, the source of happiness and joy. Like a block of marble, through baptism, the Holy Spirit chips gently at the material of our life until it conforms to the image desired. The image it's developing is of course that of Jesus. It's an image we hold in common. We all look alike when it comes to this heavenly image.

As members of a faith community, we are to be mirrors which reflect the image of Christ to one another. Sad to say, that doesn't always happen. Sometime, we see anything else in the mirror, but the same old face, day after day. So often, we say that we believe that God has created us in his image and likeness, so then, we need God's way of continuing to allow this image to become real in our lives. Sometimes this is hard; because it requires a change in our routines of life, and change can be a painful experience for us. It's only when we can accept the fact that we are not perfect people, only then we are on the way to being formed into the image of Jesus.

It is much like getting a face lift; when we go to the mirror, we don't see what was there before. Now we see something new and different, one that we truly will enjoy for ever and ever.

Next weekend, March 2<sup>nd</sup> & 3<sup>rd</sup>, we will have our annual mini-retreat in preparation for the


